David Harvey writes, "Future historians may well look upon the years 1978-1980 as a revolutionary turning point in the world's social and economic history: revolutionary impulses seemingly spread and reverberated to remake the world around us in a totally different image. In short, this was an instance of profound transformation; it was the dawn of the counterrevolution, by no means immune to the changes in the larger political landscape." Black activists and intellectuals also felt the ground moving beneath their feet in 1980 as many would gradually shift from an all-out advance towards liberation to a posture concerned with what James Turner described as the preservation of the modest gains made by African Americans over the last decade. The previous decade witnessed an obvious waning in the Black Liberation Movement: a slew of high-profile manhunts, arrests, court cases, and outright criminalizing of radical activists; the unearthing of COINTELPRO; the blooming of the Liberation Movement in Southern Africa; a taxing debate around various articulations of Marxism and Black Nationalism; the full swing of feminism and a full decade of African Studies, which also meant institutionalized space to foster such discussions.
