eighth army britain s most famous field army of the twentieth century landed in italy in september 1943 and fought continuously until the defeat of the germans in early may 1945 this book studies the experience of eighth army in the italian campaign examining how a force accustomed to the open spaces of north africa adjusted to the difficult terrain of italy where fighting became much more a matter for the infantry than for the armour it also compares the qualities of the commanders of eighth army in italy montgomery leese and finally mcreery the book uses official records at various levels personal accounts some never before published and published material to present a picture of an army that although defined as british was one of the war s most cosmopolitan formations its soldiers came from the uk canada india ireland nepal new zealand poland and south africa as well as from palestine the jewish brigade and from italy itself

when germany s sixth army advanced to stalingrad in 1942 its long extended flanks were mainly held by allied armies but as history tells us these flanks quickly caved in before the massive soviet counter offensive which commenced that november dooming the germans to their first catastrophe of the war however the historical record also makes c

this book reconstructs the fate of italian prisoners of war captured by the red army between august 1941 and the winter of 1942 43 on 230 000 italians left on the eastern front almost 100 000 did not come back home testimonies and memoirs from surviving veterans complement the author s intensive work in russian and italian archives the study examines italian war crimes against the soviet civilian population and describes the particularly grim fate of the thousands of italian military internees who after the 8 september 1943 armistice had been sent to germany and were subsequently captured by the soviet army to be deported to the ussr the book presents everyday life and death in the soviet prisoner camps and explains the particularly high mortality among italian prisoners giusti explores how well the system of prisoner labor personally supervised by stalin was planned starting in 1943 a special focus of the study is antifascist propaganda among prisoners and the infiltration of the soviet security agencies in the camps stalin was keen to create a new cohort of supporters through the mass political reeducation of war prisoners especially middle class intellectuals and military élite the book ends with the laborious diplomatic talks in 1946 and 1947 between ussr italy and the holy see for the repatriation of the surviving prisoners

her majesty s government in the united kingdom have decided to publish the most important documents in the foreign office archives relating to british foreign policy between 1919 and 1939 in three series the 1st ser covering from 1919 1930 the 2d from 1930 39 the 3d from mar 1938 to the outbreak of the war

this is the first account in english of a much overlooked but important first world war battlefield located in the mountains astride the border between italy and the austro hungarian empire not well known in the west the battles of isonzo were nevertheless ferocious and compiled a record of bloodletting that totaled over 1 75 million for both sides in sharp contrast to claims that neither the italian nor the austrian armies were viable fighting forces schindler aims to bring the terrible sacrifices endured by both armies back to their

rightful place in the history of 20th century europe the habsburg empire he contends lost the war for military and economic reasons rather than for political or ethnic ones schindler s account includes references to remarkable personalities such as mussolini tito hemingway rommel and the great maestro toscanini this alpine war had profound historical consequences that included the creation of the yugoslav state the problem of a rump austrian state looking to germany for leadership and the traumatic effects on a generation of young italian men who swelled the ranks of the fascists after nearly a century isonzo can assume its proper place in the ranks of the tragic great war clashes alongside verdun the somme and passchendaele

military historians have often regarded the roll of the italian military as somewhat bi polar during the first world war italy sided with the allies including britain france russia and the u s against germany and the central powers during the second world war it signed on as a member of the tri partite powers joining nazi germany and imperial japan the legacy of the latter often presents a less than positive appraisal of the italian soldier s performance one espoused both by its enemies and allies however a positive consensus appears when focusing on the bersaglieri translating as sharp shooter and acting as shock troops often leading both assaults and defences as the tip of the spear they would thus pay the price during the italian wars of unification the early colonial forays into africa wwi the ethiopian war and lastly wwii with much bersaglieri blood soaked up by european soil as well as the burning sands of africa and frozen in the vastness of russia over 300 images including rare unpublished photographs chronicle italy s elite plumed warriors
