civil society has become a major power in the world the stunning defeat of the controversial and secretive multilateral agreement on investments the massive worldwide wto protests and the yearly meetings of the world social forum are testimony to its coming of age from these significant victories civil society continued to catch world attention with the arab spring the grassroots movement that helped elect former us president barack obama and the significant gains of the anti fracking campaign with tens of millions of citizens and over a trillion dollars involved in advancing its agenda civil society now joins the state and the market as the third key institution shaping globalization however it cannot fully mobilize its resources and power as it currently lacks clear understanding of its identity shaping globalization argues that global civil society is a cultural institution wielding cultural power and shows how through the use of this distinct power it can advance its agenda in the political and economic realms of society without compromising its identity nicanor perlas outlines the strategic implications for civil society both locally and globally and explains that civil society s key task is to inaugurate threefolding the forging of strategic partnerships between civil society government and business such authentic tri sector partnerships are essential for advancing new ways for nations to develop and for charting a different sustainable type of globalization using the model of the philippine agenda 21 we are shown how civil society and progressive individuals and agencies in government and business are demonstrating the effectiveness of this new understanding to ensure that globalization benefits the environment the poor and society as a whole this reprinted edition includes a new afterword

examining how youths in fourteen industrialized societies make the transition to adulthood in an era of globalization and rising uncertainty this collection of essays investigates the impact that institutions working with social groups of youths have upon those youths abilities to make adult decisions determining their life courses covering both europe and north america the book includes case studies and contains country specific contributions on conservative social democratic post socialist liberal and familistic welfare regimes as well as data from the globalife project filling the gap in the market on the micro effects of globalization on individuals and taking an empirical approach to the topic this impressive volume brings the individual and nation specific institutions back into the discussion on globalization

since the 1980s advocates of free market forces and unrestrained individualism have succeeded in making their views dominant worldwide in this timely startlingly honest wide ranging and profound book dennis loo shows that free market

fundamentalism aka neoliberalism make us not more secure or prosperous it tears the social fabric and undermines security leading inevitably to disasters on the micro and macro levels neoliberalism aims to eliminate job and income security the social safety net unions pensions public services and governmental regulation of corporations it consequently undermines the basis for people to voluntarily cooperate with authority as almost everyone is increasingly left by themselves to face gargantuan private interests with governmental and corporate authority ever more indifferent to the public's welfare loo points out that given this trend the government must rely on ever increasing deception fear and force in order to keep people in line no matter which political party is in power this is the underlying reason why the democratic and republican parties are less and less distinguishable from each other and why both parties have been moving politically to the right loo tells this story of two worlds in contention those who uphold private interest vs those who defend the public interest by drawing from everyday life to illustrate and bring alive what might otherwise seem to be disconnected and disparate disturbing developments even after reading only one chapter you will come away from globalization and the demolition of society looking at the world differently

incorporating original fieldwork carried out over a period of more than ten years combined with innovative theoretical argument globalization culture and society in laos presents one of the first sociological investigations into modern laos boike rehbein gives a fascinating overview of contemporary lao culture and society whilst linking local and national phenomena to tendencies of globalization and the history of the region the book introduces a new theoretical approach based on the sociology of pierre bourdieu applying this sociology to the interpretation of lao history it also examines various aspects of lao culture and society including economics politics language higher education music and religion rehbein concludes by attempting to synthesize these cultural elements with the impact of globalization to give a synopsis of contemporary lao society written by an expert in lao history and culture familiar with the language and the people this book will be of huge interest to students and scholars of laos southeast asia social theory and globalization

globalization knowledge and society addresses the issues involved in the development of sociology as a global discipline and the increasing interpenetration of national traditions cultures and economies through global change classic issues of relativism and universalism are raised in a new context the related problems of tensions between national sociological traditions and the international discipline are explored finally the book considers the transnational process of social change particularly as exemplified in international actors such as the green and peace movements this innovative volume drawing on papers from international sociology addresses key questions for all those interested either in th

today s complex social and economic problems leave many people in the affluent world feeling either overwhelmed or ambivalent even the small percentage of us who have examined the ethics behind our financial decisions and overcome the often deterring factors of self interest rarely know what to do to make any difference by providing tools for examination and concrete actions for individuals communities and society at large justice in a global economy guides its readers through many of today s complex societal issues including land use immigration corporate accountability and environmental and economic justice beginning with a basic introduction to the impact of economic globalization the book provides both critical assessments of the current political economic structures and examples of people and communities who are actively working to transform society each chapter concludes with questions for discussion and reflection

mysterious and dangerous place clannish and dilapidated filled with sweatshops vice and organized crime in this well written and engaging volume jan lin presents a real world picture of new york city s chinatown countering this orientalist view by looking at the human dimensions and the larger forces of globalization that make this vital neighborhood both unique and broadly instructive using interviews with residents firsthand observation archival research and u s census data lin delivers an informed reliable picture of chinatown today lin claims that to understand contemporary ethnic neighborhoods like this one we must dispense with notions of monolithic community when he looks at chinatown lin sees a neighborhood that is being rebuilt both literally and economically rather than a clannish and unified peer group he sees substantial class inequality and internal social conflict there is also social change most visibly manifested in dramatic episodes of collective action by sweatshop workers and community activists and in the growing influence of chinatown s denizens in electoral politics popular portrayals of chinatown also reflect a new global reality as american cities change with the international economy traditional assumptions about immigrant incorporation into u s society alter as well lin describes the public disquiet and official response regarding immigration sweatshops and the influx of asian capital he outlines the ways that local state and federal governments have directed and gained from globalization in chinatown through banking deregulation and urban redevelopment policy finally lin puts forth chinatown as a central enclave in the world city of new york arguing that globalization brings similar structural processes of urban change to diverse locations in the end lin moves beyond the myth of chinatown clarifying the meaning of globalization and its myriad effects within the local context

since the 1970s various sociological approaches have tried to understand and conceptualize the global yet few of them have systematically addressed the full spectrum of social relationships prominent exponents of the global approach such as world systems analysis instead have focused on particular domains such as politics or the economy under the label of world society however some authors have suggested alternatives to the predominant equivocation of society and the nation state the contributions to this volume share that objective and take their point of departure from the two most ambitious projects of a theory of world society world polity research and systems theory mapping out the common ground and assessing their potential to inform empirical analyses of globalization

the era of globalisation brought waves of consolidation in business ownership alongside leviathan like state actors digital disruption too can leave market power in a relatively small number of hands in organisational and economic terms global oligopoly is now a fundamental idea for business and society which this book explores and analyses this book focuses on global oligopolies starting with an analysis of global concentration and profits in all sectors before moving on to illuminate the geographical spread and global strategic orientation choices and performance outcomes of global oligopoly contemporary cooperation modes such as cross border m as and strategic alliances niche and emerging market champion strategies are also analysed in detail to move the reader towards understanding likely future directions for the field presenting empirical data on strategies and performance outcomes the book covers a range of industries to provide practical research based guidance for more effective global business strategies and policy perspectives
