the united states on events in the emerging bahamas placing the heretofore marginalized history of the island nation firmly into the orbit of atlantic historiographical literature among other things the books sheds light on the role played by the islands in a series of significant events in the u s history these include the american revolution in which four of the initial official military actions of the fledgling u s navy comprised repeated invasions of british controlled nassau capital of the bahamas the american civil war during which nassau became one of the main bases for supply of vital goods and ammunition to the confederacy the intrigues of the volstead act which legislated prohibition but also caused the temporary transformation of bahama islands into major transshipment centers for the smuggling of alcoholic beverages to a multitude of prohibition defiant and thirsty americans and the significant role played by bahamian migrants in the creation of the city of miami and other areas of south florida the author draws on a wealth of tapped and untapped primary sources and presents a new perspective on the bahamian experience that helped to define the self proclaimed american credo of manifest destiny

islands and the american south interpreting church documents and colonial office papers in a new light johnson presents a more favorable conclusion than previously advanced about the conditions endured by victims of the african diaspora and by creoles in the bahama islands he makes use of an impressive and important body of archival and secondary research race relations in the bahamas will be a book of great interest to southern historians historians of slave societies and black communities scholars of race relations and general readers

this is the first full length ethnography of a unique community within the african diaspora rosalynd howard traces the history of the isolated red bays community of the bahamas from their escape from the plantations of the american south through their utilization of social memory in the construction of new identity and community some of the many african slaves escaping from southern plantations traveled to florida and joined the seminole indians intermarried and came to call themselves black seminoles in 1821 pursued and harassed by european americans through the first seminole war approximately 200 members of this group fled to andros island where they remained essentially isolated for nearly 150 years drawing on archival and secondary sources in the united states and the bahamas as well as interviews with members of the present day black seminole community on andros island howard reconstructs the story of the red bays people she chronicles their struggles as they adapt to a new environment and forge a new identity in this insular community and analyzes the former slaves relationship with their native american companions black seminoles in contemporary red bays number approximately 290 the majority of whom are descended directly from the original settlers as part of her research howard lived for a year in this small community recording its oral history and analyzing the ways in which that history informed the evolving identity of the people her treatment dispels the air of mystery surrounding the black seminoles of andros and provides a foundation for further anthropological and historical investigations

states the damages that all of these individual hurricanes inflicted to the bahamas on an island by island basis what is also included in the book are actual amazing pictures of all of the major hurricane damages from most of these storms including the hurricanes of 1886 1926 1929 betsy donna david andrew floyd michelle frances jeanne and wilma also included in this book is an introspective look at hurricanes how they are formed what makes them work the anatomy of a hurricane the origins of a hurricane and where the name hurricane originated and what the future hold for hurricanes by experts in the field of meteorology here in the bahamas the caribbean and the united states like professor william gray max mayfield director of the national hurricane center in miami kathy caesar tropical meteorologist lecturer at the caribbean meteorological institute and michael stubbs chief climatologists at the department of meteorology here in nassau and others who all have highlighted the need to be prepared for these storms and the damages that these storms are capable of inflicting on coastal communities also included is the track of each of the major storms that moved through the bahamas finally also included are amazing and heart rending personal recollections and experiences of most of the major hurricanes to affect the bahamas included in these recollections are crystal pintard who explained how she lost her baby in hurricane wilma in 2005 sir orville turnquest on his experiences with hurricanes and touring respective islands and being amazed by the damages that hurricane andrew had inflicted to these islands just after they had won the election also included are residents who lived through the hurricane of 1926 like mr conrad knowles on how the hurricane destroyed his father s home in long island and mrs viola collie told how she lost two of her sisters to this deadly storm living on the island of acklins mrs francita rolle who recalls on how her fisherman father prince rolle was saved from sure death when he was caught at sea in the hurricane of 1929 and was rescued by a dog called speak your mind who swam him into land on his back and then caught a crab for him to eat when they got into the land there is also an account from the present governor general of the bahamas hon a d hanna and his experiences with hurricanes growing up on the island and living in nassau also included a

saunders is to be commended for a scholarly study that prominently features the non white majority in the bahamas a group which usually has been overlooked whittington b johnson author of post emancipation race relations in the bahamas in this one of a kind study of race and class in the bahamas gail saunders shows how racial tensions were not necessarily parallel to those across other british west indian colonies but instead mirrored the inflexible color line of the united states proximity to the u s and geographic isolation from other british colonies created a uniquely bahamian interaction among racial groups focusing on the post emancipation period from the 1880s to the 1960s saunders considers the entrenched though extra legal segregation prevalent in most spheres of life that lasted well into the 1950s saunders traces early black nationalist and pan africanism movements as well as the influence of garveyism and prohibition during world war i she examines the economic depression of the 1930s and the subsequent boom in the tourism industry which boosted the economy but worsened racial tensions proponents of integration predicted disaster if white tourists ceased traveling to the islands despite some upward mobility of mixed race and black bahamians the economy continued to be dominated by the white elite and trade unions and labor based parties came late to the bahamas secondary education although limited to those who could afford it was the route to a better life for nonwhite bahamians and led to mixed race and black persons studying in professional fields which ultimately brought about a rising political consciousness training her lens on the nature of relationships among the various racial and social groups in the bahamas saunders tells the story of how discrimination persisted until at last squarely challenged by the majority of bahamians

located about 50 miles 80 kilometers off the eastern coast of florida the bahamas consists of 700 islands that extend in a chain stretching southeastward more than 500 miles 800 km this book teaches 12 year olds and up about the geography history economy and culture of the nation

on april 16 1861 president abraham lincoln issued a blockade of the confederate coastline the largely agrarian south did not have the industrial base to succeed in a protracted conflict what it did have and what england and other foreign countries wanted was cotton and tobacco industrious men soon began to connect the dots between confederate and british needs as the blockade grew the blockade runners became quite ingenious in finding ways around the barriers boats worked their way back and forth from the confederacy to nassau and england and everyone from scoundrels to naval officers wanted a piece of the action poor men became rich in a single transaction and dances and drinking from the posh royal victoria hotel to the boarding houses lining the harbor were

the order of the day british united states and confederate sailors intermingled in the streets eyeing each other warily as boats snuck in and out of nassau but it was all to come crashing down as the blockade finally tightened and the final confederate ports were captured the story of this great carnival has been mentioned in a variety of sources but never examined in detail breaking the blockade the bahamas during the civil war focuses on the political dynamics and tensions that existed between the united states consular service the governor of the bahamas and the representatives of the southern and english firms making a large profit off the blockade filled with intrigue drama and colorful characters this is an important civil war story that has not yet been told
